28th Sunday in Ordinary Time A Short reflection on today's Gospel Luke 17:11-19

"Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine?" Luke 17:11-19

Today's Gospel is a powerful reminder that no-one is excluded from God's love: His healing grace is freely given to all and His generous, compassionate heart is moved by the pitiful pleas of the suffering regardless of who they are or where they come from. The Gospel reminds us that it is not necessarily those who harbour a sense of entitlement in their hearts who are the first recipients of God's healing, saving grace.

Jesus is continuing his journey to Jerusalem when ten lepers, careful to keep their distance from him as they are obliged to do, call out to him, "Jesus, Master,! Have pity on us!" Jesus' response is instant. "Go show yourselves to the priests." he tells them, and as they hurry away they are cleansed of their foul disease. We can only imagine their joy at the realisation that the suppurating sores on their bodies have vanished: that, miracle of miracles, they have been healed of the putrid, festering disease which has forced them to live apart from others, excluded, reviled, rejected. Yet, only one, a Samaritan, returns, glorifying God. He throws himself at the feet of Jesus and thanks him. This one man of the ten sees the truth: he recognizes in Jesus the saving, healing action of God and his gratitude is heartfelt.

Jesus, may we live our faith in humility and gratitude for the gifts your heavenly Father's healing grace bestows on us daily. May our hearts be open and receptive to the gifts of love, comfort and consolation which God sends us so often through the kindness of those around us. May we cultivate gratitude and banish the discontent from our hearts which blinds us to the goodness and the glory in our lives.
