The resurrected Jesus appears to his amazed, frightened disciples, and wishes them peace. The word 'peace', as uttered by Jesus, has a powerful meaning beyond the meaning we might normally attribute to it. The peace breathed on his disciples by Jesus is the perfect state of mind, heart, soul and spirit which envelops us as we rest in the truth, the truth of our redemption by our Saviour's passion, death and resurrection, the truth of eternal life, the truth of eternal bliss in the glorious presence of God, our Father. It is the faith, hope, and love present in and informing our lives.

There is a wonderful tenderness and caring made manifest in today's Gospel. The express purpose of the resurrected Jesus' appearance to his beloved disciples is to soothe their fears and allay their doubts. He wants them to go out to proclaim the truth of our salvation wrought by his passion, death and resurrection, and in order to do that they must be free from all doubt and confusion. He needs them to be aware that everything which has taken place is part of a divine plan for our salvation. And so he verifies his resurrection by showing them his wounds; he makes the reality of his presence clear by eating and drinking with them. He takes them through sacred Scripture to show them the meaning of his death and resurrection.

Jesus is a Teacher motivated by love for his pupils, by his wish to liberate them into the clear and invigorating air of truth and knowledge so that they can liberate others.


