As a parish community we look forward to the ordination of Deacon Michael McCaul to the Priesthood here at Saint Eugene's Cathedral on Sunday 29th January at 3.00pm. He will be celebrating his first Mass at the Cathedral on Monday 30th January at 7.30pm and there will be refreshments available afterwards in the Cathedral Hall. Everyone is welcome. We ask you Lord Jesus, to fill Michael with the fire of your love, that his ministry may reveal your presence in the Church.

A short reflection on today's Gospel

John's work is done; Jesus' work has begun and, significantly, his message echoes the message of John: 'Repent, and believe the Good News.'

John has carried out his ministry of repentance and salvation far from any seat of earthly power, choosing instead the wilderness as his pulpit, locusts and wild honey as his staple diet, animal skins to cover his nakedness. He is 'the thing itself', 'unaccommodated man'.

Today's Gospel witnesses Jesus gathering about him his first disciples. He doesn't seek them out among the rich and powerful, nor among the sophisticated and highly educated; instead he seeks out ordinary men, fishermen, men who work hard to earn a living. The word 'respect' means 'to look again' and this second look is deemed to see beyond the superficial first look to the less visible truth of a person. Jesus always looked again. He always saw the truth which lies in the human heart. Here he sees the purity of heart of these simple fishermen. He sees their true worth, and their true worth has nothing to do with earthly power or sophistication. He recognises their truth and they recognise his truth.

Jesus, may we always take the time and effort to 'look again' and seek the true worth of those around us rather than indulge in superficial judgements.

As part of its 150th Anniversary Celebrations, Saint Eugene's Cathedral is hosting an Ecumenical Service on Monday 23rd January at 12.30pm. This celebration is being held during Christian Unity Week, a week when Christian Churches throughout the world come together to pray for the unity that is Christ's gift to the Church. The theme for this year's week is 'Be-Longing: Praying for Unity amidst Injustice', with a particular focus on the injustice of racism.

Bishop Donal Mc Keown will be joined by the Church of Ireland Bishop of Derry and Raphoe, Rgt Rev Andrew Forster and by schools from throughout the City, to pray, 'that our hearts will be open to see and hear the many ways in which racism continues to destroy lives, and to discern the steps we can take as individuals and communities to heal the hurts and build a better future for everyone.' Everyone is welcome.

An interdenominational service for Christian Unity will be held in Oakgrove Integrated College, Gransha Park on Wednesday 25th January at 7.30pm. The event will be led by the Corrymeela Community. All are welcome.
