Ash Wednesday - A Day of Fast and Abstinence

There is an obligation to fast
(one main meal and two light meals in the course of the day) and to abstain from meat.

The law of fasting obliges all Catholics (except the sick) between the ages of 18 and 59 years.
The law of abstinence obliges all Catholics over the age of 14 years.



A short reflection on today's Gospel *Luke 6:39-45*

Can the blind lead the blind?

Jesus' teaching in today's Gospel, if we open ourselves to its truth, reaches into the most hidden part of our being: that part of us which we keep hidden away in the shadows; that part of us which hates in others the very thing we hate in ourselves. Since Adam blamed Eve rather than take responsibility for his own sin, humankind has shown more than a tendency to bury, deep in the shadows of their being, those parts of themselves of which they are ashamed. This is what Jesus, from whom nothing is hidden, meant when he called us hypocrites, condemning in others the very faults which we ourselves are guilty of.

Before we concern ourselves with the 'mote' in the eye of another, we need to have walked the path of truth ourselves: the truth of who we are, the truth of our own transgressions, and the truth of our failure to 'own' the whole of our being, warts and all.

'From the fullness of the heart, the mouth will speak.'

Only when we walk the path of truth will we be able to prostrate ourselves before Jesus and offer thanks for his forgiveness, his compassion and his understanding entering our souls and illuminating our lives; then we can wholeheartedly offer that same compassion, that same forgiveness and understanding, to others. If we walk the path of truth which banishes our hidden shadows with its bright and kindly light, we will never have the temerity to judge others for merely reflecting our own sins back at us. Amen

Forty Hours Adoration



Blessed Carlos Acutis

Blessed Carlo Acutis, an Italian Catholic teenager, was beatified in Assisi, Italy on 10th October 2020. He documented Eucharistic miracles around the world and catalogued them all onto a website that he created himself in the months before his death from leukaemia. Carlo was known for his cheerfulness, his care for others, his computer skills and his deep devotion to the Eucharist, saying it was his “highway to heaven”. There is a display in the Cathedral dedicated to Blessed Carlo Acutis and prayer cards which you are welcome to take.



The Prayer Garden, which is located behind the Grotto, names all the parishes of the Derry Diocese and includes prayers for those who died during the pandemic. Fifty-one rose plants have been planted to remember those who died from each parish in the diocese since March 2020 when there were restrictions on wakes and funerals. The Garden will not be officially dedicated until a later date, however, everyone is welcome to come and pray or reflect.

Starting conversations in our parishes



"We have to look at where the Lord is leading us in order for us to be effective in making new disciples for the Lord"

Pope Francis is inviting the faithful all over the world to come with him “on a journey” as a “Synodal Church”. The word ‘synod’ means “walking together” and “indicates a way of being together as Church and ‘discerning’ how best to spread the Gospel amidst the challenges of life in the 21st century.”

This Synodal Process entitled, *For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission* coincides with the start of the two-year Synodal Pathway for the Catholic Church in Ireland which will lead, in time, to a National Synodal Assembly in Ireland.

We pray that the next two years will be a time of prayer, listening and discernment, involving a consultative conversation. This will allow all people - both within the Church and in society at large, to share their insights into the Catholic Church in Ireland – past, present and future – so that we can prepare for a National Synodal Assembly in the coming years.

Bishop Donal explains this is the start of our Synodal Journey: *"We have set ourselves in Ireland a five year period, to look together in a prayerful context where God is leading His Church"*
