A short reflection on today's Gospel Matthew 16: 13-20

You are Peter and on this Rock I will build my Church

Despite his sometimes failures of courage and faith, Peter is passionately devoted to Jesus, fierce and unswerving in his love for his beloved Master; now he has been chosen and touched by the loving hand of God who has revealed to him His Son's identity as the Christ. As flawed members of humanity there is comfort for us in this: it is the passionate faith and truth in our hearts which renders us lovable to God. Peter will betray his beloved Master again after his arrest by denying him three times, but when the cock crows his mighty heart will almost burst with the weight of his remorse and grief. Knowing all of this, Jesus chooses his passionate, loving, flawed friend to be the Rock on which he will build his Church; he knows that Peter, open to the Holy Spirit, will grow in strength and power, in courage and knowledge. He will become the rightful heir to his beloved Jesus.

'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God. is his answer to Jesus' question,' Who do you say I am?' Thomas Merton describes the Christ as 'the Blinding One.....who speaks to us gently on 10,000 things.....who shines not on them but on us from deep within them.'

In his birth, in his living, his teaching, his dying, Jesus reveals the nature of Divine love. Our experience of Christ is our experience of the light of the Divine that we experience in all things we see and feel and love and touch.

Jesus, may our hearts burn, like Peter's, with the truth of Divine love. May we always experience remorse for the ways we offend against the beauty and purity of that Divine love, striving to be more deserving of God's free-flowing mercy and forgiveness.
