A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 14: 12-16, 22-26

Today's Gospel witnesses Jesus' supreme act of love for humanity with the breaking of bread for his disciples:

"He broke the bread and gave it to them. "Take it," he said, "this is my body." Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks, he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, "This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many,"

Great love and great suffering.

If we are to follow the way of Jesus truly, then only great love and great suffering are strong enough for the journey.

Thomas Merton tells us about a transcendent experience he once had which took him to the heart of great love. He experienced everyone around him 'shining like the sun.' He was no longer separate from others: he was theirs; they were his. He saw the secret beauty of their hearts, 'the core of their reality, the person that each one is in God's eyes.'

Merton concludes with the wish that we could see ourselves and others as God sees us: as we really are. Then we will have become one with the heart of Christ.

Great love and great suffering. The only way. The way of Jesus.
