Monday 13th to Friday 17th May there will be Novena Masses at 6.30am and 10.00am each morning and an evening service with a guest speaker at 7.30pm.

Monday (13th) Sr Gilchrist, is a Cistercian Nun in Tautra in Norway. She will speak to us about God's will.

Tuesday (14th) Keith Graham, is from the Waterside and will speak to us why he is a Catholic.

Wednesday (15th) Sr Lucia, is a Nun in the Order of St Basil and she will speak to us about working from the Front Line in the war in the Ukraine.

Thursday (16th) Joseph Kim, from North Korea will speak to us about his journey of escape from North Korea to freedom.

Friday (17th) Archdeacon Robert Miller, our neighbour will speak to us about choosing God's will.

Saturday (18th) the 10.00am Mass will be celebrated for all those who have died.

The Novena Closing Ceremony will take place on Sunday 19th May at 3.00pm with the blessing of roses and candles.

St Thérèse candles will be on sale at the back of the Cathedral. At the statue of St Therese there will be a petition box to place your petitions for this Novena.

A short reflection on today's Gospel John 15: 9-17

Today's Gospel is a shining miracle of clarity and truth. Jesus leaves us in no doubt about the true meaning of our lives. We were created by Love and we were created to love, to love our Creator and to love His creation. These are the two great commandments at the centre of our existence, the two great commandments which give true meaning and purpose to our lives. To live out of these two great commandments is to know the peace which the world cannot give, the peace with which Jesus blessed his beloved disciples: 'the peace which passes all understanding'. It is to know and experience true liberty of mind, heart and soul: liberty from the hatred which sickens love, liberty from jealousy, greed, duplicity of heart and mind. It is the peace which is a true foretaste of heaven, which is heaven's gate itself.

In today's Gospel Jesus enjoins us to 'remain

in his love'; in other words, to abide in his love, to take up permanent residence in his love. It is not to flit in and out of his love. It is to 'remain' despite the frequent invitations by the world to abandon the truth and take refuge in a house built of lies.

Jesus, may we hold fast to the truth of the purpose and meaning of our existence here on earth, which is to love: to love God and to love each other.
