A short Gospel reflection Luke 17: 5-10

As Jesus, led by faith and courage, draws ever closer to Jerusalem and his Passion, he uses every opportunity to prepare his apostles for their future ministry without him. In today's Gospel, he makes it clear that faith must be the driving force of their life together—a faith that, proverbially, can move mountains.

Earlier, Jesus had instructed them to care for the little ones—the vulnerable in their midst—to forgive repeatedly those who hurt them, and to seek reconciliation where there is division. Overwhelmed by the weight of this mission and perhaps doubting their own capacity, the apostles ask Jesus to increase their faith. In response, he tells them that even faith as small as a mustard seed has the power to achieve what seems impossible.

But Jesus also reminds them that faith is not about grand gestures or seeking recognition. Instead, it is shown in the quiet, daily commitment to live according to his teachings—with humility, perseverance, and love. He warns them not to seek praise or reward, but to serve others with selflessness and self-denial, recognising that all we do is in response to the grace we've received. "We are merely servants; we have done only what was our duty."

Lord Jesus, may we live our lives as you did—with steadfastness and courage. Let our faith be revealed in acts of love, compassion, and forgiveness. Teach us to serve humbly, without seeking praise, and to trust that even the smallest seed of true faith can move mountains.

Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood: We pray that our seminarians and those discerning a vocation to the diocesan priesthood will, in the words of St Paul to Timothy, "...fan into a flame the gift" [of faith] and "...never be ashamed of witnessing to the Lord..." as they rely on the power of God to keep them faithful to their calling.
