A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 6:1-6

The message in today's Gospel is clear and explicit: our often sycophantic admiration for the powerful, the prestigious and the prominent in society can blind us to the truth that God, more often than not, locates extraordinary good in 'ordinary' people. In today's Gospel Jesus is preaching in his home town. His eloquence, his wisdom and his learning are all obvious, but his listeners are perplexed and reluctant to accept his words. In fact, they openly reject him. How can the son of a mere carpenter, they mutter, a carpenter himself, manifest such wisdom, such learning! How can he be taken seriously! Their narrow vision of reality blinds them to the truth that this limited worldview is not shared by God. In God's eyes we are all of inestimable value. We are all His children. With God, style never trumps substance. And when he was on earth His beloved son always saw beyond surface appearances into the hearts of the men and women he encountered. It was always to the truth in the hearts of people that he responded.

Jesus, may we never be so blinded by false attachments to worldly power that we cannot see God at work in ordinary people doing extraordinary things.

Jesus, may we never be so blinded by snobbery and self-seeking that we fail to recognise the opportunity offered to us daily by God working in the poor and the suffering, to enrich and deepen our lives with love, generosity, humility and compassion.

Jesus may we never forget that we are all children of God, all of equal and all of inestimable value.
