## Reflection for the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year C

To be a Christian is to take our own death seriously—to face the reality that each of us will one day die. That may sound sombre, but it's a fact. Our death will come, sooner or later. Abraham, the father of faith, understood this truth. He knew his life would end, but he didn't spend his days hiding or waiting for death. Instead, he set out on a journey with his elderly wife, Sarah, trusting completely in the God who created him and had already done great things for him. Even though Sarah was far beyond childbearing age, God promised them a son. Sarah was 90, and Abraham was 100 when their son Isaac was born. God rewarded Abraham because he was the first to believe the promise made to him and his descendants. He heard, he believed, and he acted on that belief. He showed true faith.

Abraham never lived to see the Messiah, the Son of God. But we, as Christians, are blessed to live in a time when Jesus is present to us—body, blood, soul, and divinity—at every Eucharist. We can kneel before Him in the monstrance during adoration. The only requirement is faith.

**In today's Gospel, we are reminded**: "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." So we must ask ourselves: What is in our treasure box? Is it filled with the pleasures and gadgets of this world—things that will one day pass away? Or is it filled with the gifts that come from truly following Christ—gifts that will last into eternity?
