#### Reflection on today's Gospel: Matthew 22: 1-14

Many are called but few are chosen

The parable of the wedding feast in today's Gospel is a stark reminder that while God issues the invitation to eternal life, the onus is entirely on us whether to accept or refuse that invitation: in other words whether to choose heavenly bliss or absent ourselves from it.

We choose to accept God's invitation to eternal life if we focus on the central values of the Gospel and live out those values fully, the values of love, kindness, forgiveness, healing. To live those Gospel values must be our sole focus, and there our salvation lies.

Jesus, in today's Gospel, is speaking to the chief priests and the Pharisees, both self-righteous groups of men who insisted they had a direct line to God and therefore the right to exercise authority over and command total obedience from those they regarded as lesser beings. But what Jesus knew and deplored was that the chief priests and Pharisees had effectively refused God's invitation to eternal bliss, pursuing instead pride and arrogance and worldly pursuits; in other words because of their refusal to live out the values of love and kindness, of forgiveness and joy.

Lord Jesus, help us to maintain a clear and committed focus on Gospel values, and to realise that it is in doing this that we shall be the wedding guests lovingly welcomed to the feast.
