
The Little Way Novena in honour of St Thérèse of Lisieux

At 3.00pm today (Sunday) our Little way Novena will end with a ceremony of prayer and thanksgiving. A short reflection on today's Gospel John 13:31-33, 34-35

Judas separates himself from the light of Jesus' presence and goes out into the darkness of greed and betraval. After Judas leaves, Jesus turns to his friends to prepare them for what lies ahead of him, and them. He will not be with them much longer. They must prepare for his departure from their earthly lives by listening with their hearts as well as their ears to his words now.

Jesus makes an over-arching truth clear to his beloved apostles. God is an infinite outpouring of love and only those who live in love live in God. Only through love do we know who God is and only through love do we know who we are. The apostles are told by Jesus to love one another as he has loved them. They will be known to be his followers in time to come by the love they bear one another. Love is the warm beating heart of the Good News.

Jesus, it is in you, the Son of Man, that God has been glorified. May we listen to your words with our whole being, and with your words safely ensconced in our hearts, may we live our lives with love.

Jesus, we know that love is often an act of will. May we will ourselves to love others at times when our egos are urging us in the opposite direction.

Jesus, may we never forget that only by living in love do we live in God.
