

A short reflection on today's Gospel

Today's Gospel witnesses the Pharisees' devious attempt to trap Jesus out of his own mouth. After their initial flattering comments on his integrity, they bring their own natural dualistic, either/or, thinking into play with their question: 'Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?' If Jesus answers that only God can command their obedience, it leaves him open to an accusation of treason; if he encourages them to pay taxes to Caesar, he can be accused of betraying the 'religious purity' of his own people. Jesus' response makes it clear that the ideal and the real are not necessarily mutually exclusive.

To 'give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar' is relatively simple. To give to God what belongs to God is to accept the centrality of love in our lives; to accept that love is the beginning and the end of everything. It is to accept that as imperfect, flawed human beings, we cannot give God His due without the aid of his mercy, compassion and grace. Alone we are weak and vulnerable. To succeed, we must empty ourselves time and time again of our egos and fill ourselves with the glorious presence of God: God in us, we in God.

Jesus, may we accept our utter reliance on the Holy Spirit to send love through us and from us as we journey through life.

National Year of Prayer for Vocations to the Diocesan Priesthood – As we pray this weekend for all those spreading the gospel in "the foreign missions" we continue to pray for those called to serve as priests here in our own diocese, and particularly for anyone from our own parish who may be contemplating a vocation to the priesthood.
