## A short reflection on today's Gospel Mark 4:35-41

Today's Gospel challenges our faith at its core. It asks, "Do I really know who Jesus is? Do I really know his power? Do I believe that he is always with me, calm and peaceful in the midst of life's storms, ready to save me?

Jesus suggests to his disciples that they should take a boat and cross to the other side of the lake. He is tired and falls into a calm and deep sleep, his head resting on a cushion. Without warning, a storm erupts fiercely, so fiercely that his disciples, some of them seasoned fishermen, are terrified, and shout at him to wake up and save them. Jesus stands up in the boat calmly, subdues the storm, and then rebukes his disciples for the lack of faith which their terror has clearly manifested. They have witnessed his miracles; they acknowledge him as their Master, their Teacher, and yet they fail to realise that there is no need for fear when they are in the presence of the Son of God. They still do not know Jesus.

Jesus, may we always remember, in the midst of life's storms and terrors, that you are never absent from our lives: you are walking with us, day and night, in storm and in calm. May our sleep be calm and peaceful because our trust in you is absolute.

Jesus, may we always remember that the greater our faith in you is, the greater will be our peace and serenity of soul and spirit.

Jesus, you crossed over to the other side many times in your ministry of healing. You crossed over to the other side when you reached out to the poor and the marginalised, the outcasts and the despised. May we too cross over to the other side in our need to separate from the materialism, consumerism and power-hunger of the world, to walk with you, Jesus, in peace, in love and in humility. Amen.

The Lough Derg Pilgrimage provides a breathing space in which people can calmly explore and reflect on where they find themselves in their lives at this moment in time. The Diocese of Derry Three Day Pilgrimage led by Bishop Donal McKeown starts on Friday, 26th and concludes on Sunday, the 28th July. Bus will depart after 10:00am Mass from St Eugene's Cathedral, Derry on Friday 26th July, going via Strabane, Lifford and Ballybofey. Cost £80 including transport. Cost without transport £70. Annual Service of Intercession for the Dead takes place in the City Cemetery on Sunday, 30th June at 3.00 pm. Please be in position at 2.30 pm.

Families are asked to bring their own holy water to the Cemetery for the blessing of the graves. At the appropriate time Bishop McKeown will ask a representative of each family to sprinkle their family grave (and neighbouring grave if there is no-one present). There will be no holy water in the Cemetery.

130 car parking spaces will be made available for Blue Badge holders within the Cemetery. The places will be allocated on a first come first served basis to current Blue Badge holders and can be booked at www.derrystrabane.com/cemeterysunday.

There will be no vehicle access to the cemetery from 12pm to facilitate preparations for the service. Access will only be given to those who have registered with gates remaining open until 2pm. Those who have secured a space must be in place by 2pm, as there will be no access for vehicles after this time.

Other car parking will be available for blue badge holders at St Mary's Church, Creggan, St Cecilia's College and Celtic Park. Booking is not required, and access will only be given to vehicles that display a current Disability Blue Badge Permit on arrival. For visitors parking outside the cemetery, we ask that you please park in appropriate areas and be considerate of people living in the area. Do not block roadways, footpaths, or gateways when parking. This is an important time of prayer for families who are remembering loved ones, and we ask that everyone is respectful and mindful of other visitors during the service. We encourage those attending to arrive in good time, and to adhere to the advice of the stewards. We would greatly appreciate cooperation with staff to ensure everyone can have safe and easy access to this time of prayer.
