A short reflection on today's Gospel

Like last Sunday's Gospel, the Gospel today is multi-layered in terms of its powerful meanings, revealed over many and careful readings. It teaches us that although humans alone have knowledge of the finiteness of their earthly existence and are plagued with anxiety and fear resulting from that knowledge, death does not have the final word. Jesus, himself the resurrection and the life, through the raising of Lazarus conquers death and shows us that our fear of death is, in fact, the real stone that must be moved away if we are to be liberated into the glorious light of resurrection and eternal life. Jesus instructs us to fear neither darkness nor death: "Are there not twelve hours in a day? If one walks during the day, he does not stumble, because he sees the light of this world. But if one walks at night, he stumbles, because the light is not in him."

Today's Gospel also points to the paradox of death: while it releases us to be where we have always longed to be, with God, our physical absence leaves a legacy of grief to those we have loved and who have loved us. Jesus, as fully human as he was fully divine, shares in the heartbreak and tears of the grieving: 'And Jesus wept.'

Jesus loved that little family in Bethany: Mary, Martha, and Lazarus. The death of Lazarus has plunged Mary and Martha into terrible grief, and Jesus is moved beyond words by their tears. His own tears merge with theirs in a beautiful and touching manifestation of his humanity.

Dear God, move us into the glorious light you have created, a light so beautiful and so bright it absorbs the darkness and reveals to us the wonder of resurrection and eternal life.

It was with great sadness this week that we learnt of the death of Fr Roni Zacharias' father. Our deepest sympathy goes out to Fr Roni and his family during this difficult time. We pray that God gives you all the comfort and peace that you seek and may the soul of your father rest in peace.

Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace. Amen
