A short Gospel reflection Luke 14:1, 7-14

For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.

Jesus is drawing ever closer to his Passion. His mission on earth is almost over. He accepts the invitation to lunch from a leading Pharisee in the full knowledge that the invitation is designed to trap him in some way. The Pharisees were powerful, and ever watchful for any attempt to unseat them from the lofty position they had created for themselves; Jesus' teaching on love and forgiveness, kindness and compassion, has no appeal for those who are committed to worldly hierarchical structures.

Fearlessly, Jesus through his parable of the wedding makes it clear those who seek first place out of a sense of entitlement, will be humbled and shamed while the humble man content with the lowliest place, will be exalted and honoured.

We are reminded that when Jesus, the Son of God, came into the world, there was no place for him, and throughout his ministry he chose to live among the poor, the crippled, the lame and the lowly. The message is clear: it is humility which leads to the glory of eternal life. It is in feeding the hungry and the rejected that we will share in the banquet of the Lord when the 'virtuous rise again.'

Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood: We pray that those called to serve the Church as priests of this diocese will be the gentle, humble, sensible, and attentive servants mentioned in our first reading this weekend.
